Biosketch

Richard Grallo is currently an associate professor of applied psychology in the Audrey Cohen School for Human Services and Education at Metropolitan College of New York. Dr. Grallo began teaching at the College in 1983. Currently he teaches a number of courses in applied psychology in the undergraduate program.

Since 1993, Dr. Grallo has also been an adjunct faculty member in the Department of Applied Psychology at New York University. There he has taught graduate and undergraduate courses in research methodology, measurement, and content courses in counseling, developmental and educational psychology.

He was trained as a researcher in educational psychology, receiving his PhD from New York University in 1988. In addition he has received post-graduate training in clinical psychology at Hofstra University. Dr. Grallo is a Fellow at the Albert Ellis Institute, a founding member of the Association for the Advancement of Educational Research, a member Phi Delta Kappa and numerous other scientific and professional organizations.

Research interests include problem solving, decision-making, self-regulation and the application of mathematical models and multivariate methods to social science problems.
