Biosketch

Paul Grobstein, the Eleanor A. Bliss Professor of Biology at Bryn Mawr College, has published papers on the organization and development of the nervous system in crayfish, rabbits, and frogs, as well as on the brain in relation to mental health, social organization, education, and philosophy. He currently describes himself as an "applied neurobiologist," reflecting his interest in studies of the nervous system that contribute to thinking about a wide array of human concerns and how they in turn contribute to suggesting new directions for research on the nervous system. Grobstein has, in addition, a long-standing commitment to innovate science education. He was founding director of the College's Center for Science in Society, and is currently director of the College's K-12 summer institute program, and co-founder of the Serendip website.
